At A Glance: CALHOUN COUNTY

Nestled between the capital city of Columbia, SC and the Port of Charleston, Calhoun County attracts globally-recognized businesses like Starbucks, Devro and Zeus Industrial Products. Formed in 1908, the county was named after John C. Calhoun who served as U.S. Vice President, Secretary of War, Secretary of State, and Senator. The county seat, St. Matthews, is located in the geographical center of the county and just 32 miles from Columbia. Calhoun County is business ready, with a mix of industrial acreage and buildings across roughly 381 square miles of business-friendly soil.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The Central SC Region is home to four major interstates, all easily accessible throughout the region: I-20, I-26, I-77, I-95. These interstates make for smooth travel when commuting to the region's major airport and the state's major port.

Columbia Metropolitan Airport (CAE): within as little as a 20 minute drive away, it features the Southeast Regional UPS air hub and Foreign Trade Zone 127.




